Virtual School Kent's Participation Team are here to:

- Encourage all Children in Care, Care Leavers, Adopted Young People and the Sons and Daughters of Foster Carers to speak up, voice their opinions and to help shape Services for Young People. We ensure your voices are heard by the important people who make decisions about you.
- Work to ensure that young people are represented, and their views are front and centre when Services are being designed and staff are being trained. We do this by working with and alongside many other Children and Young People's Services.
- Organise lots of activities for you in the holidays and throughout the year so you can try out new hobbies, make friends and have fun in person & virtually!
- Celebrate your successes and achievements at events throughout the year, in our newsletters and on our website.
- Give you extra support when you are going through big changes in your life.


